General Information

1) What is the Scott High School Class of 1961 scholarship program?

Funds are donated by the Scott High Class of 1961 to assist Boone County graduates in obtaining a college education. Students apply to the program and, if eligible, may be awarded a scholarship from the Scott High Class of 1961.

2) Am I eligible to apply?

Please read through the following criteria to see if you are eligible.

- You must be a resident of West Virginia and will be entering your freshman year of college.
- You must be a full time student at a Boone County high school.
- You must demonstrate academic achievement (at least a 2.5 GPA).
- Income level is considered, but no specific income is a requirement for this scholarship.

3) What is the deadline to apply?

The original application must be received by 5:00 p.m., or postmarked by Friday, April 12, 2019. No application will be considered after this date. All application materials must be sent together as a single packet and the application must be computer prepared, typed or hand printed.

Do not staple the application.

4) Is this application available on the Website?

5) When will I find out if I have been awarded a scholarship?

Applicants will be notified on awards day at their school.

6) Are these scholarships taxable?

Monies received for tuition, fees and books may not incur tax liability while

This award is to be applied to direct college expenses at the institution, such as tuition, fees and books. The recipient is responsible for any tax liability incurred as a result of this award. The Scott High School Class of 1961 does not provide tax information to the student or the Internal Revenue Service. The student is fully responsible for all tax reports.

7) If I am awarded a scholarship, how much will I receive?

The Scott High Class of 1961 Scholarship is a \$1,000 award. This is subject to change depending on the available funds.

8) Where can I go to school with these scholarships?

There are no set restrictions on the university or college you choose. This may change in the future.

9) If I withdraw from school, what do I do about the scholarship?

A student who withdraws from school for any reason will be expected to notify the Scott High Class of 1961 of his or her status and refund any unused portion of the scholarship.

10) Does the Scott High School Class of 1961 make the decisions about who is awarded a scholarship?

The Scott High School Class of 1961 Scholarship Selection Committee selects the recipient.

11) If I am awarded a scholarship, do I receive the check?

The Scott High School Class of 1961 will mail a check in the amount of \$500.00 prior to the start of each semester for your first year. The check will be made payable to the school.

12) If I receive a scholarship for one year, will I automatically receive that award for the following year?

No. The current scholarship funds are non-renewable.

13) Do I need to send a copy of my parents' IRS form?

Personal Essay – **On a separate sheet of paper**, take time to prepare a developed, well-written, grammatically correct essay. While GPA, ACT/SAT scores, financial need, etc. are important selection criteria, a good essay often sets one student apart from others. The essay is to be **limited to one-page** in length. **See Page 10.**

Transcript – If you are a high school student, provide a transcript that includes grades (your GPA and Cumulative GPA) from August, 2018 through January, 2019 (fall semester). **Do not send your application unless you include your Fall 2019 semester transcripts. DO NOT SEND TRANSCRIPTS SEPARATELY!**

PLEASE SEND THE ORIGINAL COMPLETE AND COLLATED APPLICATION FOR A COMPLETE PACKET. ALL APPLICATION MATERIALS MUST BE SENT TOGETHER AS A SINGLE PACKET RECEIVED BY THE SCOTT HIGH SCHOOL CLASS OF 1961 OR POSTMARKED APRIL 12, 2019. FAXES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED. NO EXCEPTIONS!

While GPA, ACT/SAT scores, financial need, etc. are important selection criteria, a good essay often sets one student apart from others. The essay is to be **limited to one-page** in length. You may want to write about an interest you have, a challenge you've met or something you are passionate about. The objective is to give you a chance to tell us about another dimension of you not previously revealed. There is no "correct" way to respond to this essay, however, good sentence structure, interesting details, and a well-thought sequence of writing will make you look better. In writing about something that matters to you, you will convey a sense of yourself. **The essay must be computer prepared or hand printed.**
